Bible Institute for Prisoners Extends Nationwide Reach

TUCSON, AZ: Genesis Bible Institute, an Arizona Bible school created to assist incarcerated persons with moral and spiritual rehabilitation, is pleased to announce its nationwide expansion. Inmates in seven states across the country are currently enrolled in distance learning coursework or in the enrollment process.

"Our mission is to prepare humble hearts to begin again," said Fred Bayer, Vice Chairman of the Board for Genesis Bible Institute. "God's fingerprints have been on Genesis from the beginning, and we are delighted to have the opportunity to help incarcerated men and women across the nation experience a new beginning in Christ."

Genesis Bible Institute is the prison ministry arm of Genesis College and Seminary, a 501(c)3 formed in 2018 by an interdenominational team of pastors, teachers, professors, administrators, and inmates. The institute is unique in that it offers courses in English and Spanish to inmates at no cost. The ministry is operated, managed, and funded by a team of volunteers in multiple states throughout the country, including Arizona, Texas, Tennessee, and New Jersey.

"We are also unique because our courses have been developed with the input of prisoners, making the program relevant to their needs, struggles, challenges, and concerns for the future," said Board Chairman David Johnson. "The courses have rigor, are challenging, and most importantly help inmates experience spiritual and practical life transformation."



Johnson also said that well-known leaders give oversight and counsel to the ministry, including Richard Luebke, Board Chairman for Pima Medical Institute and Dr. John DelHousaye, Professor of Biblical Studies at Arizona Christian University.
