

Syllabus CHL 220: Spiritual Leadership Genesis Bible Institute

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course examines the biblical principles of spiritual leadership. While many Christian leaders rely on the latest and greatest secular leadership books to develop their skill set, the Bible proves to be a timeless treasure of leadership principles for those who desire to lead by the Holy Spirit.

ASSIGNMENTS AND GRADING

- Study Guide Answers (worth 60 points / 60% of grade)
 As you read Spiritual Leadership, you will be prompted to answer questions from the Study Guide. Each unit of the Study Guide poses 5 questions that relate to the content of the unit. There are a total of 30 questions. Each answer is worth 2 points.
- Assignment 1: Analysis of Your Leadership Potential (worth 20 points / 20% of grade) In this two-part assignment, you will answer 27 self-examination questions and then create an action plan based on the results. Part 1 must be a minimum of 675 words and Part 2 must be a minimum of 400 words for a total of 1075 words.
- Assignment 2: Leadership Critique (worth 10 points / 10% of grade) You will write an 500-word (minimum) 5-paragraph essay that critiques a leader with whom you are familiar. The purpose of this assignment is for you to apply course concepts to a real-life practical situation.
- Final Exam (worth 10 points / 10% of grade)
 The exam consists of short answer questions and will help measure your knowledge of course concepts.
